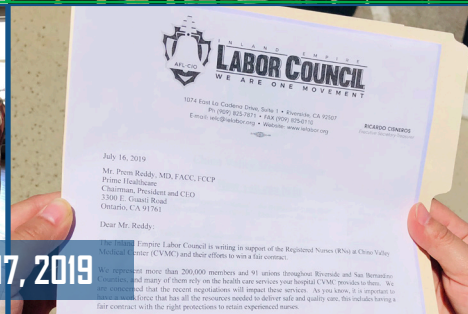
The Labor Community Stands in Support of Chino Valley RNs In Our Fight to Win a Fair Contract

We have strong allies and community support. Our bargaining team has addressed the Inland Empire Labor Council (IELC) about our RN turnover crisis, and representatives from multiple IELC unions and elected officials, including Assemblymember Freddie Rodriguez and State Senator Connie Leyva, have delivered letters to Prime's CEO, supporting Chino RNs.

"We know that we need good quality nurses in this area and we need to be able to retain them," said Celene Perez, Political Director for the IELC, when delivering letters on July 17.

Excerpt from the IELC's letter:

We represent more than 200,000 members and 91 unions throughout Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, and many of them rely on the health care services your hospital CVMC provides to them. We are concerned that the recent negotiations will impact these services. As you know, it is important to have a workforce that has all the resources needed to deliver safe and quality care, this includes having a fair contract with the right protections to retain experienced nurses.
